

## Expansion of 25C federal tax credit is compelling



The federal tax credit 25C has not only been expanded but extended and that could be a game changer for those wanting to install a heat pump, according to some in the industry. "If there's going to be something that's transformative for 2023 for heat pumps," says Dana Fischer with *Mitsubishi Electric* in the April edition of the *HVACR NEWS*, "it's really the 25C tax credits. The other components (of the Inflation Reduction Act) are going to take a while to get started." The lifetime limit of \$500 per household for the 25C tax credits has been eliminated. Homeowners now could be eligible for a credit of up to **\$2600** annually on ongoing improvements including energy saving doors, windows & insulation in addition to installing a qualifying HVAC equipment. The credits themselves have been increased

to 30% of the cost up to **\$600** for installing a **97%** gas furnace; **\$600** for installing a qualifying air conditioner (16 SEER2/ 12 EER2); and **\$2000** for a qualifying heat pump (15.2 SEER2 / 8.1 HSPF2 plus three other parameters). Another part of the IRA that is still to come is the High Efficiency Electric Home Rebate Program **(HEEHRP)** which will have household income limitations and according to many in the industry may not be available until 2024.
